FIRE SAFETY 101

In December 2017, the PS 20 PTA hosted workshops for parents and students. Many parents realized that there were tips about preventing fires and staying safe in a fire that they did not know.

- What is the best thing to use to put out a kitchen fire if you don't have a fire extinguisher? Baking soda.
- Smoke detectors expire. Each smoke detector has a date on the back. It should be replaced 10 years from the listed date.
- Most fires take place between the hours of 10 p.m. and 2 a.m.
- When warming up your car when it snows, make sure your exhaust pipe is clear of snow. If not, poisonous carbon monoxide can be trapped in your car.




Answer:
